

December 30th 2007: The Feast of the Holy Family



THE FLIGHT INTO EGYPT

This year the Gospel of the Feast of the Holy Family is taken from St. Matthew's account of St. Joseph's second dream, in which God warned him to take his young wife and the infant Jesus away from the danger of Herod's rage and envy to the relative safety of Egypt. It is an event which recalls the exile of Jacob and his sons in Egypt many centuries before, from which the great Exodus under Moses had eventually freed their descendents, the twelve tribes named after each of Jacob's sons. St. Matthew sees in the "Flight into Egypt" the Holy Family symbolically reliving that ancient exile, so that once again God could "call His Son out of Egypt" and back into His own Land. Once again we learn of Joseph's great faith in God's command. St. Matthew tells us how important for the fulfilment of God's plans was the obedience and the courage of St. Joseph, who had to face great dangers and difficulties in protecting both the Mother and the Son of God from all harm in such a perilous journey through unknown lands among strangers. Matthew even tells us that the journey was accomplished "by night", in order to impress upon us the hazardous nature of the undertaking and the weight of responsibility which St. Joseph bore.

Today at Mass in place of the homily we will hear a Pastoral Letter from His Grace the Archbishop on "Marriage and Family Life", in which he reminds us that "the Holy Family is an image of the Church", and that this image "also applies to each and every family, with a marriage at its heart". The Archbishop says that "to embrace the reality of God's presence within marriage and family life is to embrace a prospect that draws us into eternity"; and in order to get there, "daily life is the ladder of our ascent". So we pray today for God's blessing on all our families at Christmastide and throughout the year ahead. It is so important for us to realise that even the Holy Family in all its graced life of joy, had to encounter and overcome many difficulties, as do we all, but never without God's help.

MARY, THE MOTHER OF GOD

Although we are used to thinking of Our Blessed Lady as the Mother of God, and honouring her as such, we must remember that there was a time in the history of the Church when certain theologians denied that Mary was God's Mother. They were prepared to allow that she was Mother of Christ the Lord, but claimed that she could not be, nor could any human person be, the Mother of Almighty God. But the Church constantly believes otherwise, and at the Council of Ephesus in the year 431 A.D. the Bishops of the Universal Church met together to decree solemnly that the faith of the Church fro the time of the Apostles has always been that Our Blessed Lady is indeed the "God-bearer" or, in Greek, the "Theotókos". To celebrate this definition, Pope Liberius built a magnificent Church in Rome to honour Mary the Mother of God, the Church we still know today as "St. Mary Major", adorned with beautiful ancient mosaics depicting the role of the Mother of God and the Old Testament prophecies fulfilled in her. The Roman Church from those times has honoured "The Mother of God" on January 1st.

St Sylvester (d.335) He was Pope at the accession of Constantine to the Roman Imperial Throne in 312, and for the first time, the Church was liberated from persecution. Pope Sylvester organised public worship in Rome, and when the Emperor gifted the palace of the Laterani family for his use as a residence and cathedral, the Pope dedicated it to our Blessed Redeemer and the two St Johns (the Baptist and the Evangelist), both of whom are depicted on either side of Our Blessed Lady in the mosaic behind the High Altar of our Church.
