# Holy Week In Jerusalem: The Work of our Redemption

At last we have arrived at Jerusalem for this week, rightly called "Holy Week", the most important of the year. On this Sunday we commemorate Our Lord's triumphal entry into the holy City, acclaimed by the crowds waving palm branches and crying "Hosanna!". This triumph is so soon to be followed by His sufferings. Nevertheless, His sufferings are not a reverse of His triumphal entry, but are its fulfilment. Our Lord came not to establish an earthly kingdom, like an Emperor or a military leader, but rather He came to found a kingdom of truth and love. It is this which shines out on the cross. Our Lord is victorious in His acceptance of death which He could have avoided had He wished. As He prays in today's Passion according to St. Matthew, "Father, if it be possible, let this chalice pass from me, nevertheless, let it be not as I will it, but as You will it." The week ahead will see the unfolding of the implications of this prayer.

#### Conscience

Our talks on Conscience have proved very timely. How often have you heard a phrase like this: "I'm fed up of religious people ramming their religion down other people's throats!" Well, the very people who complain about t, are the same ones who are now doing just that to everyone else! It is the secularists who hold the whip hand and are ramming their anti-God, anti-faith agenda down all *our* throats! Witness this Government which is absolutely determined to force all Labour MPs to vote for animal hybrids, abolition of the right to a father, and easier abortion, just as they

All persons between their 18th birthday and their 60th birthday are obliged to keep this law. <u>Abstinence</u> from meat and food containing meat products must be observed by all who have reached their 14th birthday.
