## **CITIZENS OF THIS WORLD AND THE NEXT**

In today's Gospel reading from the Last Supper discourse in St. John, Our Lord gives us a new commandment: "Love one another as I have loved you". As Catholics we know that we are called to become like our Lord in a way that goes far beyond the ordinary standards of this world. and yet we are called upon to begin to do so within this world. This would be impossible except for the power of God's grace in the Church's Sacraments. Of course, very few of us actually get close to that kind of perfection in this life, yet that does not mean that we should give up trying.

We are called to be citizens of heaven, "saints", as the Apostles put it in their New Testament letters to the early Christian congregations they had founded. Yet we also have to live out our Christian life in this world, too. We are citizens of this world insofar as we have to contribute to the Common Good. One of the most fundamental ways in which we can do this is by exercising our

This coming Thursday is an important day in our lives as citizens of this world. Once in every five years we have an opportunity, perhaps we should even see it as a *duty*, to cast our vote for the candidate(s) who seems to us to be best qualified to protect our society. Such protection can only truly come about when God's law is followed. That is why the Church always insists on the fundamental importance of respecting human life in all its stages, from natural conception to natural death. We should make it our business to find out what the candidates who seek our support actually intend to do with the power we give them, and let them know that this will certainly affect the way we cast our vote. The last Parliament was the most anti-Christian and anti-life in this country's history and the next will probably be no better unless we help to make it so. We now have an opportunity to try and redress the balance and seek the election of those who will uphold Christ's teaching and God's law. This teaching is not some narrow Christian concern-it is for the common good of all citizens. Nothing that Christ and His Church teach about human nature and life is "partisan", as though it only applied to Catholics or Christians. One often hears it said that Christians should not "impose" their "views" on society as a whole. Yet note how even many non-believers who hold some position to be central to their lives will fight to see it defended even though it means imposing it on others! But there can be no position more central, more fundamental, than life itself. Take that away and nothing is left. You can't benefit from the common good or have any rights at all if you have been killed off in the womb!

Sometimes one hears criticism of the pro-life movement even by some Catholics, on the grounds that it is "overzealous". Yet as Archbishop Chaput of Denver, USA, says: "Every political movement has its zealots and opportunists. Political engagement will sometimes be marked by excesses of enthusiasm and a lack of prudence. And some people will inevitably seek to use the Gospel and the Church for their own partisan advantage. But Christians are called to be the best of good citizens. We have a duty to work for justice and the common good. We may not excuse ourselves from that obligation by citing the foolishness, selfishness, or hypocrisy of others, or the human imperfections of the political causes that deserve our energetic support." We should reflect carefully on what the Archbishop says here. We have no right to excuse ourselves from this battle simply because it is uncomfortable or because we don't agree with the way some people are struggling to defend the good.

You will find at the Church doors a sheet with information which has been gathered from the candidates for Edgbaston and Ladywood constituencies, in which most of us live, which you may find helpful in assessing how they intend to vote in parliament should we help to send them there. Please give this information your careful consideration before voting on Thursday, and may God guide us all in our choices!
