### October 26th 2008: THE THIRTIETH SUNDAY OF THE YEAR



#### LOVE OF GOD AND LOVE OF NEIGHBOUR

After Our Lord had confounded the Pharisees as we heard last week, their great opponents the Sadducees decided that they also would like to try Our Lord's intelligence themselves. So they asked Him: "what is the greatest commandment?" Our Lord's reply was to quote the familiar First Commandment but, without waiting for an answer He immediately added: "the Second is like it: You must love your neighbour as yourself". Why did He do this? It was in order to emphasise to them that "the whole of the Law and the Prophets depend upon these two commands."

When He refers to "the Law", Our Lord does not mean a legal system, as we would mean. He is referring here rather to the "Books of the Law," which are the first five Books of the Old Testament, also often referred to as the "Pentateuch" or Books of Moses, to whose authorship they were ascribed. Hence, when Our Lord was transfigured on Mount Tabor, Moses appeared with Him in order to demonstrate that Our Lord is the fulfilment of the Law.

Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself

The reference to the Prophets is more straightforward, since the Books of the Prophets constitute an immediately recognisable later section of the Old Testament. The prophets' role throughout the history of the Jewish people was to recall them to repentance from sin, and thereby to restore their proper relationship with Almighty God, their Father. Hence, too, the presence at Our Lord's Transfiguration of the greatest of all the prophets, Elijah, along with Moses. Our Lord is the fulfilment of the entire teaching of the Old Testament, beginning with the Five Books of Moses in which the Chosen People receive God's Law, and of the Prophets through whom the Holy Spirit spoke to the Jews.

## HFE BILL—THE GOOD NEWS AND THE BAD

The Human Fertilisation and Embryology Bill was given its third reading in the Commons last Wednesday. During the debate, Mr Edward Leigh, the MP for Gainsborough who spoke at the Pro-Life meeting held here a few weeks ago, told the House of Commons: "I believe that human embryos are emphatically not just blobs of cells; they have the entire genetic make-up of a human being. I believe not that they are potential human beings, but that they are human beings with potential. ... There is something very dangerous in what we will undoubtedly do today. We are making ourselves less than human, in a sense, by viewing one part of human creation as a thing, a spare part, which I believe is extraordinarily dangerous."

Meanwhile, a big thank-you to all who have played a part in the campaign against the bill. John Smeaton of SPUC writes that "We are enormously grateful to people who have written to and telephoned their MPs, delivered leaflets, prayed, fasted and donated to the campaign against this bill. This has been a gruelling and drawn-out campaign - particularly against the pro-abortion amendments which have been hanging over us since the sudden postponement of the bill last July...The exclusion of these amendments is a great tribute to all those activists, clergy and others who have kept up the pressure on MPs and the prime minister. For month after month, it seemed there was no hope of avoiding the raft of pro-abortion amendments which were tabled by pro-abortion MPs, who were emboldened by the defeat of time-limit proposals in May. But our thousands of loyal supporters stuck at it. Tragically the bill represents a major new attack on the dignity and lives of human embryos created by in vitro fertilisation. Its deadly provisions will cost the lives countless tiny human beings. However, we thank God, and all our supporters and co-workers, that the abortion law has not also been made worse."

The bill has to go back to the House of Lords, where peers can review the embryology amendments made in the Commons and can try to lessen the damage of the bill - but sadly do not have scope to defeat it.

### And finally...CARDINAL NEWMAN'S CAUSE

The end of this week sees a series of special celebrations connected with the Cause for beatification of our Cardinal. The few remaining first Class relics of the Cardinal's hair will be placed, together with fragments of cloth from his grave, in the Upper Hall of the Cloister Buildings for veneration from Thursday night to Sunday morning. The Archbishop particularly asks that we take time to make a prayerful vigil in the presence of these precious relics, until the time when they will be solemnly carried in procession to the Church for Mass on Sunday, November 2nd, at the end of which His Grace the Archbishop will enshrine them in St. Charles's chapel until a permanent shrine can be prepared for them.

**Sts Simon & Jude** (1st C.) Simon is called the "Zealot" in the Gospels, to distinguish him from Simon Peter and the name may refer to his earlier connection with the Jewish resistance movement to the Romans. Jude, whose name was abbreviated from Judas, is distinguished from Judas Iscariot by the name "Thaddeus". Simon is said to have preached in Egypt and Persia. Jude is the author of an Epistle to the eastern Church. He is the patron of desperate causes because his epistle stresses that the faithful should persevere in harsh and difficult circumstances. It is thought that saints were martyred together in Persia.
