The Provost writes:

BEATIFICATION NEWS AND A FEW CHANGES AT THE ORATORY

As most of you know, it is now virtually certain that our Cardinal, John Henry Newman, will be beatified during the visit of the Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, to our country in the middle of September next year: The exact date and venue have yet to be announced. Obviously, preparations for this are going to be a priority as 2010 arrives. One of the aspects of the Beatification of Cardinal Newman which is ever more far-ranging that the ceremony itself, is the on-going preservation of his very large archive—his letters, manuscripts, artefacts and so forth. Anyone who has ever visited the Oratory House will know just how extensive this is. Some time ago the Fathers decided that a properly constructed and staffed Archivium had to be built in order to preserve this precious collection for future generations. They also decided that a proper Visitors' Centre be built in order to cope with the number of pilgrims that might be expected to come to the Oratory once Cardinal Newman is beatified.

Such schemes cost money and money has to be raised. In order to facilitate this Fr. Felix Selden, the Apostolic Visitor to the Oratory (the Pope's representative in other words) has asked me to take on the job of being Promoter and fundraiser for these important undertakings. I will be working in close conjunction with the Cardinal Newman Society of America, whose President, Patrick Reilly, was here last week. Such work means for me quite a lot of travel, especially in the USA. Because of these absences and in order to help the Oratory here in Birmingham during these coming months, Fr. Felix has asked for Fr. Richard Duffield (a novice here 20 years ago and now a father of the Oxford Oratory) to come back to Birmingham. The Oxford Fathers and Fr. Richard in particular have responded generously to this invitation, and we in Birmingham are most grateful to them.

2010 will be an exciting and demanding year for us all. Please pray for God's blessing on all our undertakings for Cardinal Newman, the Oratory and the Universal Church.



ST. JOHN THE BAPTIST'S MISSION

Last Sunday we heard the voice of John the Baptist calling the people to repentance in preparation for the coming of the Christ.

Today we hear some of the teaching that he gave in answer to the questions various groups asked of him. Tax collectors came to ask his advice. Remember that these men were collaborators with the Roman authorities and got rich at their own fellow-citizens' expense. No wonder they were hated! Yet John did not drive them away with angry denunciations. He did not forbid the payment of taxes. Instead he told them not to take more from the people than was their due.

Then some soldiers came to John. These, too, would have been regarded with great resentment by the people on account of the fact that they kept the pagans in power. They asked John how they should change their ways. He told them quite simply not to intimidate people, nor to use their power to extort money from them as bribes, and not to grumble about their pay. His advice was practical and straightforward and prepared the way for Our Lord's even greater teaching in the Sermon on the Mount, and the final commandment at the Last Supper: "Love one another as I have loved you."

St John of the Cross (1542-91) A Carmelite friar in his native Spain he agreed to assist his friend St Theresa of Avila in reforming the Carmelite Order which had become very lax and thus the Discalced Carmelites were founded. He suffered much persecution from his community, resistant to change. Known as the 'Mystical Doctor', he wrote many mystical works including Ascent to Mount Carmel and The Dark Night of the Soul.

Blessed Anthony Grassi (1592-1671) An Oratorian at Fermo in Italy, he was renowned for his serenity and was a much sought-after confessor and adviser, even to Cardinals. Despite his obvious humility, he insisted on ensuring that he, and the fellow members of his community kept the Oratorian constitutions. He was considered to be truly like St Philip Neri in all ways.
