May 25th 2008: SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST



CORPUS CHRISTI continued

Today is *Corpus Christi Sunday*. We began our celebrations of Corpus Christi-tide on Thursday last with two wonderful Masses: the first in the morning was celebrated with the schoolchildren from our Primary School; the other a Solemn High Mass in the Extraordinary Form (*alias* "Tridentine") with an indoor procession of the Blessed Sacrament concluding with Solemn Benediction.

You may wonder why Corpus Christi begins with *Thursday* in the first place. It is on account of the fact that it was on a Thursday that the Blessed Sacrament of the Eucharist, the Sacrificial Rite of the Mass and the Sacred Priesthood were all instituted at the Last Supper. In memory of that first Maundy Thursday we now celebrate all these wonderful things. Since Maundy Thursday was too close to the sufferings of Our Lord to offer any but the briefest celebration of such a momentous gift as the Eucharist, the Church took the first suitable opportunity after Holy Week and Eastertide were over, to return at greater leisure to celebrate this gift. So it came about that on the same weekday, namely the Thursday following Trinity Sunday, af-

ter the white days of Paschal- or Eastertide are over and we have returned to "Ordinary Time" with its green vestments, the Church established the tradition of this joyful celebration of our Lord's Body and Blood in the Blessed Sacrament. But the celebrations are not over yet! Because we have had to wait so long to reflect and rejoice at Our Lord's wonderful gift of His own Body and Blood, the Church wants us to prolong the celebration over several days. So today we continue this sequence of special days with the Solemnity of *Corpus Christi Sunday*, during which we will of course celebrate our usual variety of Sunday Masses. Yet, to add to the splendour of this holy day, some twenty of our Parish schoolchildren will receive holy Communion for the first time to at the 12 o'clock Mass, the most fitting day for them to do so. Then we will extend the celebrations with our annual outdoor procession of the Blessed Sacrament, accompanying our Lord's Sacramental Body with hymns and prayers around the grounds of the Oratory and the Plough and Harrow and Hagley Roads, to give witness to our faith and our reverent joy to our passing fellow citizens. Do please come along and join in! The more that come, the greater the impression and the more joyful the throng! The procession pauses several times briefly for a scripture reading and prayer to allow us to reflect on the mystery of Holy Communion. (And please pray for good weather!) Finally in the evening we will celebrate Vespers with all the grandeur that the Church's liturgy offers us.

THE FEAST OF OUR HOLY FATHER, ST. PHILIP NERI

It is a happy coincidence that the Feast of our Holy Father St. Philip falls this year on the day following Corpus Christi, for this was exactly the case in the year 1595 when St. Philip died in the early hours of the morning after celebrating the Mass of the feast the morning before with more than usual joy, (joy being especially characteristic of St. Philip throughout his life.) Tomorrow, Monday, we will celebrate our customary Solemn High Mass at 11 a.m., at which a good friend of our community will be celebrant and preacher, namely Abbot Cuthbert Johnson, former Abbot of Quarr in the Isle of Wight. We hope that many of you will come to share our joy on this special feast, particularly as it most fittingly happens to be a public holiday as well. Whether the weather is good or bad, you will find no better or more joyous way of spending a holiday than by making it a holy day! Holy Days should be just that: "holidays" in their original sense. Our Lord and Mother Church intend us to find joy in the expression of our faith. So do come to the Corpus Christi procession this afternoon and the High Mass tomorrow morning, and prolong the celebrations in whatever fitting way you can in between and afterwards!

This week we also celebrate: the **Dedication of the Church** on Thursday, the **Sacred Heart of Jesus** on Friday, and the **Visitation of our Lady** on Saturday. Please also note the night vigil on Friday to join together the feasts of Our Lord's and His Mother's Hearts.
