THE FORTY HOURS



We have recently been granted many great joys: notably, only three weeks ago seeing our Holy Founder, Cardinal Newman, enrolled among the Blessed in heaven; being visited on the same day by our Holy Father the Pope; and then only yesterday the first ever celebration of the new Feast of Blessed John Henry Newman

Consequently we have decided to hold our annual festival of the Forty Hours Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament a little later than usual—in fact, during this coming week rather than during the first week of October when we have been used to holding it.

For the future also, in order not to celebrate Blessed John Henry and the Forty Hours too close together, we will be moving the Forty Hours to the midweek nearest to the Feast of the Holy Cross, September 14th.

But for now we have a lot to look back on with great gratitude to God— mostly for the blessing of the beatification, and for the success of our Holy Father's visit to our country, our city and our Oratory. We should always remember the duty of giving thanks to God for His many blessings. That is why we should be especially careful to make arrangements to come to the Forty Hours this week.

Then also we must remember not only to thank God for recent blessings, but to pray for all that may lie ahead of us. We now stand on the threshold of a new era in the life of the Church in England and in Blessed John Henry's Oratory. God has give us these great joys in order to inspire us to make good use of the opportunities they present. We are to carry forward the work that Blessed John Henry has bequeathed to us, and that the Pope has recommended to us. None of this work can be done without the constant help of Almighty God. We cannot hope to do any good thing for God if we attempt it without Him. That is why we hold the Forty Hours each year, so that we can draw strength, comfort, inspiration and new life from our Lord and Saviour's living presence in the Sacred Host, exposed in the monstrance above the Altar for us to adore and to find in Him friendship and spiritual nourishment so that we can faithfully set about all He is calling us to do for Him.

From Tuesday evening to Thursday evening this week please make a special effort to come and pray in the wonderful presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed. Everyone is invited to spend at least a half hour in quiet prayer and recollection. Prayer books are provided to help focus our attention and to enjoy and use the time well. Please try and sign up for a half hour "slot" at the back of church today so that Our Lord is never left alone on the Altar, where He is waiting for us to come to Him. Candles to be burned on and around the altar during those special forty hours of prayer and adoration will also be on sale today in the Cloisters after Mass. They can also be part of your self-offering during these coming days, though remember that no candle, however large, can be a substitute for your own personal presence face-to-face with Our Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

Pope St Callistus I (d. 222) famed for his lenient treatment of penitent apostates, the best known and most visited Christian catacomb in Rome is named after him.

Friday 15th October: Saint Teresa of Avila, Virgin and Doctor of the Church, Memoria. (White)
